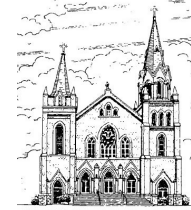

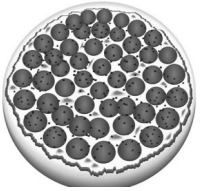

**A MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP JACKELS**
