ASK FATHER

Question: Why do we have four different Eucharistic Prayers, and what is the difference among them?

Answer: The four Eucharistic Prayers are a relatively new part of the Roman Missal. Three were added after Vatican Council II in order to express various aspects of the Church's belief in the Real Presence. Eucharistic Prayer I comes from Pope Gregory the Great (d. 604), and was used for the longest period of Church history. Eucharistic Prayer II comes from St. Hippolytus in the third century and is appropriate for daily Mass due to its conciseness; Eucharistic Prayers III and IV come from the East and emphasize the Sacrifice of the Mass and Christ as the Son of God.
